ILLUMINATIONS CONTINUE IN 2018

T&TEC's community illuminations continued apace in 2018, with six lighting projects commissioned in the month of February. Communities in east, west and south Trinidad benefitted from new lighting infrastructure funded by the Ministry of Public Utilities and installed by T&TEC's Public Lighting Department.

The illuminations began on February 5 with the Maloney Basketball and Netball Courts and Greenvale Housing Development, La Horquetta. Over 1700 residents of Greenvale welcomed the new streetlights along their main

boulevard, Milton Road, since they were becoming increasingly concerned for their safety.

The fourth largest recreation ground to be outfitted with lights was the Defence Force Reserves Playing Field, Chaguaramas, commissioned on the 15th, followed by the Palmyra Recreation Ground, Palmyra and Pond Road Recreation Ground, Lengua the next day. The Mootoo-Maharaj Lands Recreation Ground, Vistabella, illuminated a week later on the 22nd, rounded off the month's lighting up activities.

At each event the Minister of Public Utilities, Senator the Honourable Robert Le Hunte consistently reminded the residents about their responsibility to conserve energy and utilise the infrastructure wisely to ensure it lasts. Parliament and local government representatives, as well as T&TEC's Chairman, Keith Sirju and Deputy Chairman, Glenford Cyrille also addressed the residents present at the events. The T&TEC executives shared information on the Commission's service improvement projects in each area.
