


RULES & GUIDELINES

- 1. This competition is open only to secondary level students in Trinidad and Tobago.
- 2. Participants are encouraged to follow T&TEC on Facebook, Instagram, and TikTok, and share T&TEC's page with friends, to keep updated with the competiton announcements.
- 3. Participants must select one topic and can only submit one video.
- 4. Any submission by a participant under the age of 18 must be accompanied by a signed parent/guardian consent form. This applies to the main participant as well as anyone appearing in the video.
- 5. Participants must upload their videos to www.ttec.co.tt/videochallenge, by December 20th, 2024.
- 6. Videos should be recorded in portrait mode and submitted in MP4 or MOV format, with a resolution of at least 720p.
- 7. Videos should not exceed 90 seconds in duration, inclusive of credits if any.
- 8. Files should be named using the format: "TTEC_ParticipantName_Video Title"
- 9. All videos must be in English. Subtitles in another language may be included.
- **10.** All video content must be original and created specifically for this competition. Any form of plagiarism will result in immediate disqualification.
- 11. Use of copyrighted music, images, video clips or any other copyrighted material, without authorisation, is strictly prohibited.
- 12. Any use of inappropriate content, including profanity, racial slurs, explicit material, offensive language, or bullying, will result in immediate disqualification.
- 13. Participants are responsible for ensuring their video plays correctly. Technical issues that prevent viewing may result in disqualification.
